Updates to the whole school Covid 19 risk assessment

As England moves into Step 3 of it's plan to move away from full restrictions, I have once again reviewed the Whole School Covid 19 Risk Assessment.

I am writing to you today to give you an overview of the changes. Where something is NOT mentioned, that means the current practice has not changed since the last review. In summary, the new changes include:

1. Students will eat in one sitting but in a variety of locations over the sites. They will know where their given location is.
2. Students will be able to play together outside in mixed bubbles.
3. Inside clubs will be mixed bubbles but a maximum of 7 students with doors/windows open and hygiene rules followed.
4. Students do not have to wear face coverings in the classroom or in communal areas though they are warmly encouraged to continue this if they choose.
5. Students (age 11 and over) must still wear face coverings on public transport, on LA transport, in the school's MPV, and when visiting local shops, cafes and sports centres.
6. Students must still ensure they bring fresh and clean face coverings to school each day.
7. Residential trips in the UK can go ahead with the approval of Simon Coles, Group Managing Director.
8. After May half term, face to face assemblies will resume in both Lower and Upper schools.
